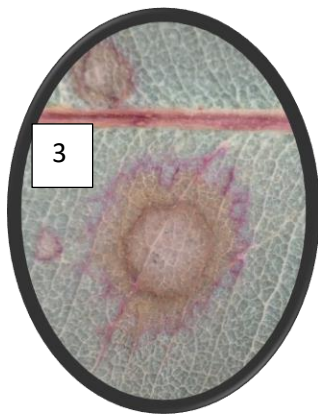

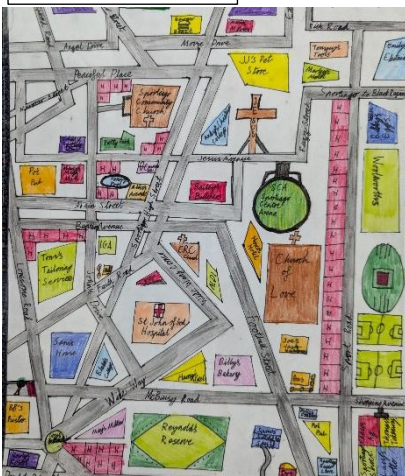
Outback Rural City by Eddie



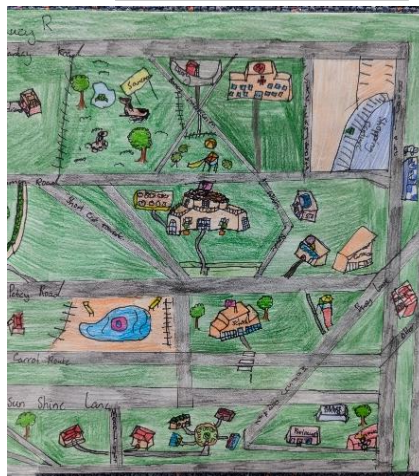
Grades 4/5/6 have been working hard on their geometry cities. Final copies now complete. All students have done an outstanding job in following the required angles that needed to be included in their city.

They will be displayed in the corridor outside the office if you would like to take a look at them!

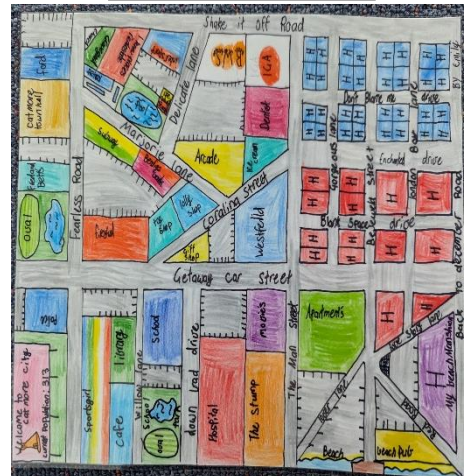
